The first thing you should know is what you're going to find here. This guide is based on real life and just dripping with good times and happiness, as it only includes places that make us happy.



You can never trust the weather to stay the same all day so we'd always recommend carrying a collapsible umbrella and flip flops in your back pack in case a summer's day turns to drizzle or vice versa. The weather changes all the time in the North and you really can experience four seasons in one day.

Be the first one down on the sand and use the Beach Hut service on our three beaches Zurriola, La Concha and Ondarreta.

TIDE APPS


Always have an app on your phone to check the TIDES. You'll use it all the time to find out when it's high tide and the beach will be jam-packed or if it's low tide and there'll be plenty of sand for everyone.

At high tide in summer, we'd recommend that you forget La Concha as it practically disappears and pick Ondarreta in the Antiguo neighbourhood or Zurriola in the Gros neighbourhood.



ON YOUR BIKE!

The best way of getting around the city is, without a shadow of a doubt, by bike. If you've just arrived, find your nearest bike rental shop and pick one up for your entire stay. Bike rentals:





SANTA CLARA

To see the city from another perspective, jump on the 'Ciudad San Sebastián' boat heading out to Santa Clara Island. You get the feeling that you're no longer walking on dry land but floating in the sea.



GABARRONEAR

If you hit on a scorching hot day, grab your swimsuit as the sun goes down and swim out to the "Gabarron" on La Concha beach (if the tide is low, you'll get there in no time). It's even more fun with friends - race out there but don't forget to pull down their swimsuits if they're getting too far ahead of you!

Make the most of it to see the sun go down from the sea, listening to the bells ring out from City Hall. Then swim back in the dark.

ZURRIOLA

A game of volleyball on Zurriola beach is another great way to finish off your day. You can see the sun go down from Sagües wall, a legendary spot among locals.

If you like a beach with big waves then Zurriola is the place for you. Rent a board and a wetsuit and get stuck in!



LA CONCHA & ONDARRETA

If you love the water but not the waves, rent a canoe or a paddle board on La Concha or Ondarreta beach to paddle off to Santa Clara Island. Once there, you can jump off on its tiny beach and have a drink at the island's bar.



1 Santa Clara Island

Jump aboard and set sail to Santa Clara Island. Climb up to the lighthouse and then explore the island by roaming along its snaking paths.

7 From the sea

Make the most of the return trip to snap away as if there's no tomorrow. The city and life out at sea are particularly photogenic.

3 The dock

A picturesque spot with a life all its own. Txalupa rowing boats, ships, fishermen and cool terraces.

Favourite apps for photo editing: SNAPSEED, MIRROR IMAGE.

4 Calle Campanario

Delve into the Old Town and look for this street so you can lean over its bridge overlooking Calle Puerto. This actually used to be a tunnel before the fire in 1813.

5 Alderdi Eder

Its gardens, the carousel and the City Hall building, a former Casino, with those lovely Concha beach railings in the background. Click away.

6 The Bridges and River Urumea

Hop from bridge to bridge, carried along by the current.

7 Tabakalera

Spectacular 100 % snappable building. You'll lose your mind on the fifth floor terrace.

8 Aldapeta hill

Drop down Aldapeta hill from the Palace and stop at our photo hotspot.

9 Aiete Palace


Its gardens, woods, swans, library and Story Tower are perfect photo spots all year round.

10 Miramar Palace Gardens

When the sun goes down and the lights come on across the bay, you simply can't go wrong. Look out over Ondarreta, the Pico del Loro and the Concha beach from the gardens. Polish it all off by looking back to where you started your day and take a fabulous shot of the majestic Santa Clara Island.

There are just so many things that make you fall in love with Donostia.

One of them is the city's beautiful architecture, so we've come up with **5 fabulous** architectural routes.


Pick any of them for a stroll and check out the heritage that gives this city its special character, packed with peculiar façades, colours and shapes just begging to be photographed.

Fall in love with all the little secrets and details that the buildings are hiding.





If we set out from the mouth of the River Urumea, we immediately spot two wonderful buildings, the **Maria Cristina Hotel(1)** and the **Victoria Eugenia Theatre(2)**. Crossing our favourite bridge (whose lampposts feature in our logo), there's the innovative **Kursaal** by Moneo. The past and the future stand either side of the river, joined by the Zurriola bridge. Following the river, we get to **La Equitativa** and the villas on the Paseo de Francia. We'd highly recommend this walk in the autumn to enjoy the amazing yellow and orange colours in the trees.



Right on the sea front at Ondarreta, we find the unusual villas that interweave different styles giving this area its particular charm. Carry on walking through Antiguo and check out the new Musikene building(4) and the Carlos Santamaria Centre(5). These two buildings are good examples of the city's most recent architecture.









You're spoilt for choice here but you really should walk down **Calle 31 de agosto**. With the historic churches of, **St Mary's and St Vincent's**, at either end, as it turns into **Plaza Trinidad**, you'll spot one of the oldest wooden buildings in the city, which even maintains its original structure. If you stand in the doorway of the imposing St Mary's Church and look straight ahead, right at the other end you'll see the svelte Buen Pastor cathedral whose Neogothic tower stands over the entire city.





Walk up the road to the lighthouse or jump on the bus as far as the Igeldo neighbourhood to admire the old Igeldo school that dominates the local square. Once there, enjoy a stroll and the views.

Although it is 10 km from San Sebastián, its historic 3-walled fronton court (one of only two in Gipuzkoa alongside Villabona) makes it well worth the walk here. If you like cycling, you can take the bidegorri from Donostia.





3 Sculptures

. You'll love:

Taking in Donostia's three beaches, the Paseo Nuevo and the city's three artistic landmarks. What's more, run at sun set and you'll be amazed by the colours of the sky.

Recommendations:


In summer, we'd recommend running early or late in the day as the promenade attracts droves of locals and visitors.

Description:

This is a popular route among locals either when they just start out running or as a regular section in their personal daily routes because it is practically flat the whole way.

The route's universal appeal is obvious as it hugs the coastline - a major attraction in itself.

On the other hand, this route has a peculiar feature as it takes its bearings from 3 works of art or sculptures by three well-known local artists. The route starts at the Peine del Viento by Eduardo Chillida, passes by the Conjunto Vacio by Jorge Oteiza and ends up at the Paloma de la Paz by Nestor Basterretxea. You can start anywhere along the route, given that it is a line on which we can move forwards and backwards.



Route:

We start out from the Peine del Viento, the first artistic spot on this route. As you begin, you'll hug Ondarreta beach as far as the Antiguo tunnel. Cross under the Pico del Loro and begin the entire length of La Concha promenade. So, we'll run all along the famous handrail passing by the characteristic Concha Clocks, and heading for two very singular buildings: the City Hall and the Boat Club.

Once past these two buildings, we get to the port with its pleasant salty smell. You get as far as the Aquarium where the path opens up along the entire Paseo Nuevo. This path takes us round to the Kursaal Bridge, running past the Kursaal cubes. Following Zurriola beach, you finish the route in Sagües, home to the final work of art, the Paloma de la Paz (The Peace Dove).

So far, you'll have run 6 km and if you feel up to it, you can run all the way back again, making 12 km.





You'll love:


Exploring new places going beyond the city centre. New Donostia is being planned along the major axis of the River Urumea so you can enjoy the river environment as you run. There's also a wide variety of bridges, reflecting all the city's architectural styles: from classic to modern.

Recommendations:

Take the route as a reference and adapt it to your ability. Change your route by cutting back across a bridge at any point. What's more, as it's a circuit, you can repeat it as often as you like.

Description:

This route runs along the main river giving the city its backbone, the Urumea, and the two banks of the river are joined by the bridges. What's more, the bridges come in all shapes and sizes, with a style to please everyone: from bridges that remind us of Romantic Donostia to more up-to-date bridges with a modern design.



The route gives us insight into the other side of Donostia as it reveals a whole host of options and spaces to discover. As we mentioned, this river and the bridges are the key to this circuit that you can adapt to your needs.

Route:

Let's start off from the Kursaal, look up-river and start running along calle Ramón María Lili, with the Victoria Eugenia Theatre and Hotel María Cristina on your right. Following the route, run inland along the Paseo de Francia, where you'll see the beautiful town houses camouflaged among the trees. Keep going straight on and you'll pass the bus station and the Maria Cristina Bridge, and then the Lehendakari Aguirre Bridge.

The next stop will be the old Iron Bridge, now known as the Real Sociedad Bridge. From here, take a turn into the Riberas de Loiola neighbourhood where you cross its main avenue and then get back to the riverside path. At this point, you'll have run half the route so you can start running back along the other side of the river. Follow Paseo Bizkaia and Paseo Gernika, admiring the modernist architecture of the houses. Keep going all along the river until you get back to the Kursaal Bridge.

This makes a complete circuit and if you want to carry on, you can go round again.

Discovering the River Urumea Distance: Round trip: → 6 km ≥ 12km Difficulty: Easy



You'll love:

Visiting the neighbouring town of Pasajes. A fishing environment that combines this work and the essence of the past with new ways of living.

Recommendations:

When you get to Pasajes, look out for the little boat that goes from one side of Pasajes to the other, in other words, from Pasai San Pedro to Pasai Donibane.

(Link to boat timetable)



Description:

This route gives us the option of being able to visit the town of Pasajes just by running a few kilometres. You'll mainly be running along the pavement, making the going a little easier. Take into account that the first part of this route is slightly uphill but it is not particularly difficult. You simply have to pace yourself. You might also bear in mind that part of this route represents the last few kilometres of the famous, popular Behobia-San Sebastián race.

Route:

Let's start at Zurriola Beach and head off for Pasajes. Cross the entire beach as far as the Church on the corner with Avenida de Navarra. Follow the path all the way until you get to Avenida de Ategorrieta. The actual path is intuitive as it is mainly straight and takes us past characteristic places such as Arzak or the La Asunción School. Then start heading down to Trintxerpe, marking the entrance to Pasajes. Along this path we can make out the port of Pasajes which is the busiest port in Gipuzkoa. If we continue the route, St Peter's Church will mark the turn to get to the end of the road. Here we can see Pasai San Pedro and Pasai Donibane standing opposite each other. And between the two, the little boat that has taken people from one side to the other for years.

On this route, you'll run a little over 5 km, plus the same route on the way back, making a 10 km run.







he Centre of the Donosti is brimming with life. It's such a luxury to be able to shop in **San Martin or Bretxa markets** that people who live in Donostia make the most of it whenever they can.

Start the day with a coffee in any of the terrace cafés on **Reyes Católicos**, you'll find a bike hire shop right there: **La Bicicleta**, jump on a bike and get pedalling.

Visit the *Buen Pastor Cathedral* (our very own Empire State building). Looking across in a straight line, you'll see another of our favourite churches, *St Mary's Basilica*, in the Old Town, but for the time being, we're going to explore the Centre area because it's a treasure trove of interesting places.

Let's start with a spot of shopping in *Koko Deko*, a perfect shop full of pretty things, where you can pick up one of our tote bags, and then drop into *Maria Kala's*, that sells home accessories and our sister mugs and keyrings.

Then take a spin around *Calzados Tello, Zubiri, Berriz, Mónica Ochotorena, Minük, Domitila, Sketch, Life Concept, Kaotiko* and *Arbelaitz*.

Get your strength back with coffee and cake at **Sweet Roma**. If you're more of a savoury type, we'd recommend **Old Town Coffee. Kafe Botanika** and its wonderful terrace are hard-wired for happiness in a unique spot next to the river for breakfast, lunch or dinner.

Tasty snacks are served up at el **Narru** opposite the Cathedral, La **Cochinita Pibil, Zazpi, Cortázar** and **Taberna de Blas. Kata 4** right next to the **Hotel María Cristina** and its terrace bar opposite the river are also not to be missed.

For lunch or dinner, there's **Bernardoetxea**, and **Restaurante Antonio**, informal snacking at **Ekeko** and the **Mamma Mía pizzeria**.

The Biarritz terrace bar opposite the Concha beach is a must. If you prefer homemade food to takeaway, there's **La Perola**.







OLD TOWN

In the *OLD TOWN*, you'll have a fabulous meal at *Polka, Atari, Urola*, or on the terrace of *148 gastroleku* in Plaza Constitución If you're out for pintxos, don't miss *Bar Martínez, Ganbara, Txepetxa, Paco Bueno* and try the potato omelette pintxo at *Néstor*.

Sweet or savoury food awaits at *Maiatza* and later on you can trot up *Mount Urgull*, just as far as *Polvorín*, the strangest bar in Donostia with a laid-back terrace and views that will take your breath away.

Dinner or small plates at any of the picture postcard restaurants on the *DOCK: Itzalian, Sebastián, Igeldo*.

Don't miss the sunset from the *Gu* terrace. If you want to pick up any of our sister products with teleporting properties, pop into *Alderdi Zahar Lore* at Calle Mayor,14

Oh and remember that you really can't leave the city without your very own Donosti Bay, that will take you right back to Donostia just by touching it, so pop into Joyería *Casa Munoa* and pick up your own Donosti Bay necklace.









ros is one of San Sebastián's most fashionable neighbourhoods thanks to its funky bars and restaurants, its amazing surf beach, its shops and its fabulous sunsets at the end of the beach in *Sagües*.

As you cross Zurriola bridge, you are greeted by two massive cubes or, in other words, the *Kursaal Conference Centre*, home of our favourite international film festival, *Zinemaldi*.

It is also home to the *ni neu* bar-restaurant whose terrace we would fervently recommend absolutely any time of day. *Zurriola* beach is ideal to jump in the water and catch a few waves. You'll find a bunch of surf schools that rent out equipment and provide instructors. *Hawaii* is a classic.

If you need a massage or a beauty treatment or just a place to disconnect from the world, look no further: **YO Salud Estética**. At the end of the beach, you'll find Sagües, the ideal place to enjoy a sunset Donosti-style, sitting on the wall, beer in hand, watching hundreds of surfers dance across the waves as the sun goes down.

It's an amazing show. You'll find it almost impossible not to take photos, but try to close your eyes, take a deep breath, absorb the salty air and store that moment in your memory for days when you really need some inspiration.









Nearby, you'll find the path leading up *Mount Ulia*, which is a lovely hike. The first section is the toughest, so keep the chat to a minimum and save your strength for finding your camera and taking thousands of photos when you reach one of the best views of the city. It'll literally make you weep with joy.

To start the day bursting with energy, we recommend *la Guinda, Norta Beach House and Alabama Café.*

For a tasty lunch in Gros, we suggest you try **Casa 887**, **Gatxupa and Galerna**.

In *Calle Zabaleta*, you can start in *Matalauva*, continue on to the mythical *Bar Bergara*, then grab a chunk of potato omelette in *Bar Zabaleta* and a craft beer at *Mala Gissona*. If you like a nice G&T, the *Gintoneria Donostiarra* and *Teorema* will make you very happy.

In the pedestrian street, *Peña y Goñi* right next to the Kursaal, you'll find one of our favourite bars *La Bodega Donostiarra*. As far as shops are concerned, you'll find bikes and accessories you'll fall in love with at *Miner* and clothing for men and women at *Central*, with brilliant brands on sale in their spectacular store.

Don't forget to check out *Pas si simple, Molupita and Carbonara.*

EGIA

The Gros neighbourhood borders with Egia, another bubbly neighbourhood where you'll find *Tabakalera*, the contemporary culture centre that hosts myriad activities.

Pop into Tabakalera to visit an Art Gallery and a Concept Store that we love: *Arteuparte*.

Then ride up to the *LABe* terrace bar for something to eat or drink.


As for lunch, we can highly recommend **Aho-mihi**. Don't leave Egia without taking a stroll around one of our favourite parks, **Cristina Enea**. Lose yourself in this park for a day. Soak up the nature, meet its peacocks, and if you take a tartan rug and some sandwiches, you can channel the picnic vibe.











ntiguo is one of the noblest neighbourhoods in Donostia. We'd recommend approaching through the *Miramar Palace* gardens because of the wonderful

views and surroundings.

If the weather's nice, pop down for a dip on **Ondarreta beach**, the city's most majestic beach with its txuri urdin (blue and white) beach tents giving it a splash of colour and fun.

Visit a shop we love, *Anhelo*: high quality costume jewellery, accessories and fragrances.

Keep on shopping: La Petite, Laukka, Petit Comité, Zapatería Kor'Est

As far as bars and funky restaurants are concerned, we'd recommend two areas. Firstly, *Calle Matia*, ideal to roam around and enjoy its atmosphere, don't miss *Antzara* and the Mexican *Mera Mera*.

Another area, a little further on, is **Benta Berri**, where safe bets include la **Rebotika**, **Kukuarri**, and el **Pescaíto de la bahía de Cádiz**, **Mogambo** and **Lobo** in **Plaza Jose Maria Sert**. For a quick coffee or a great breakfast **BB Kafe**, **Fusión Benta Berri and Trikua**.

Now you've got this far, take a look at two amazing buildings: **MUSIKENE** and the **Carlos Santamaría Centre**.

At the westerly end of the beach, you'll come across a magical spot where the waves jump up and comb the wind.

Here, where the city ends and the sea begins, *Eduardo Chillida's* steel sculptures make this place a firm favourite among locals. *THE WIND COMB.*

Behind the tennis club, you'll find the *Funicular* railway station, a real icon of the city. Everyone visiting the city for the first time should be prescribed a trip on the Funicular. This 100-year-old vertical train takes you to another world with special rejuvenating powers, the *Igueldo Theme Park*.

Stop off at the *Wine Bistrot Belle Epoque* in the *Hotel Monte Igueldo* which boasts the best views in the world.

Today, we're going to climb Mount Igeldo and then skip merrily along to Orio.

This is a classic route. It's popular among pilgrims as it's part of the Way of St James, and you really can't go wrong.

The yellow arrow will help you every step of the way

We've got two options for you:

1. More laid-back walkers can jump on the no. **bus 16**, that will drop you off at Igeldo Campsite (saving you the climb).

2. Keen hikers can leave from Ondarreta and go up the Paseo de Igeldo.

As we go along, we'll pass **Lurdes Txiki** and **Leku Eder**.

At that point, veer off towards Kristobal Balenziaga, heading right into the centre of Igeldo. You'll spot the old school - it's a classic white building presiding over the village square, a real gem.

Let's carry on along Paseo de Padre Orkolaga to our first gastro-stop, **Ekaitz Erretegia**. Although it's called Ekaitz Erretegia (meaning 'grill'), one of its greatest treasures is its cheesecake. This is an excellent choice for anyone with a sweet tooth, thought to be the best cold cheesecake for miles around.

Let's keep going, although it's worth looking back from time to time to get an alternative panoramic view of lgeldo and the side of the mountain that drops down to the sea.

Next stop is the **Orio-Igeldo Park-Picnic** spot, a great spot for a rest, to fill your water bottles at the water fountain and carry on.

A few metres later, there's a crossroads giving us two choices: follow the main road or continue up the mountain along a path that goes up to your right.

We'd recommend taking the mountain path for its great sea views. Even though it's a little longer, it's totally worth it. You'll be at the top in a jiffy, reaching **Kukuarri** and from there, you start to drop down.

The walk down to Orio beach is amazing. You'll pass the **Hotel Itxaspe** with its gorgeous pool.

Once on the sand, check out a beach bar for an aperitif.









s self-confessed TXAKOLI super-fans, we're very excited about writing this article.

Txakoli is a slightly sparkling wine. More than 2 million bottles are produced every year and it is exported to the finest restaurants on the planet. It is going from strength to strength these days but that wasn't always the case. In the early 19th century, txakoli was made and drunk exclusively in rural homesteads.

Right now, geographically, the Getariako Txakolina Protected Designation of Origin covers the province of Gipuzkoa, boasting 402 hectares of vineyards, mainly trained vines, 91% of which grow in coastal areas.

The Hondarrabi Zuri white grape is the main variety used to make TXAKOLI from GETARIA.

A spectacular place in Zarautz, with sea views. The day we discovered it, we immediately fell in love with this place. Covering 22 hectares with a traditional system of high trained vines, they grow two native grape varieties that define this txakoli, Hondarribi Zuri and Hondarribi Beltza.

A family winery on the slopes above Zarautz.

Talai Berri organises guided tours around its vineyard, including a tasting session.

Andatza Diseminado Barreiatua, 16 – Aia. +34 943 24 00 05 K5 stands 300 m above the Bay of Biscay, bringing you just that little bit closer to heaven, surrounded by 15 hectares of spectacular vineyard slopes and a forest of chestnut, oak and beech trees. 100 % Hondarribi Zuri vineyard.

This winery is not open to the public right now.

But we'd truly recommend its txakoli, we really are big, big fans.

Bring some K5 into your world and you'll see life differently.

KATXIÑA TXAKOLINA:

Barrio Ortzaika, Orio +34 943 58 01 66

This is also a magical place where you can not only taste their txakoli, but also eat in their restaurant. They organise spectacular events, so if you're planning something special, Bodega Katxiña seems like the perfect spot. Bodega Katxiña was founded in 2014 and stands in the midst of 8 hectares of vines, facing south, exposed on one slope that leads down to the River Oria.







B° Jaizubia, 266 – Hondarribia. +34 943 10 40 60 In addition to visiting the winery, you can enjoy a snack on its terrace or eat in the restaurant, known for its grill and seasonal produce.



A long, long time ago, natural cider was really important in our area's economy, so almost all homesteads had a cider press. Cider was used for bartering; it conditioned local laws and was a loyal companion for Basque fishermen and sailors during their long trips across the North Atlantic searching for cod and whales. Sailors' fondness for cider, in addition to giving them a little buzz and putting a smile of their faces, helped them fend off scurvy and so it became an essential drink for them, practically giving them superpowers. Each crew members drank two or three litres of cider a day.

A hundred years later, one experience we'd strongly recommend if you spend a few days in the North is to go to a cider house because it's a delicious gastro tradition and the atmosphere is really unique.

There are more than 70 cider houses throughout the area. Some are more modern and up to date whilst others are older and have been kept just the same as in yesteryear. Cider and the cider houses are a sign of our identity, a tradition and an unmissable annual event for locals that tourists shouldn't miss out on either.

The cider season begins in January to the shout of "txotx" and lasts until April, and cider houses are packed out around this time. If you come at another time of year, don't worry, luckily some cider houses remain open all year round.











Sister-Cider route

Donostialdea, made up of the towns of Andoain, Astigarraga, Hernani, Lasarte-Oria, Urnieta and Usurbil, is the area with the greatest concentration of cider houses, almost 70%, and it is known as "Cider Country" although cider houses can be found all over the province:

CIDER HOUSE MENU

The cider house menu consists of cod omelette, cod with green peppers and steak followed by cheese with guince jelly and walnuts for dessert, all washed down with lashings of cider.

Normally everyone eats together on long wooden tables although there are still some cider houses where people eat standing up, like in the olden days.

If you go in season, be prepared for the sagardozale ritual. The cider is always poured from the kupela (barrel). Shouting "txotx", the person in charge opens the kupela by removing the little stick (txotx) that acts as a stopper (although nowadays most have taps) and you line up to fill your

Don't get over-excited and fill it to the brim, just give yourself a taste so that you can try the cider from different kupelas and still remember where you are sitting to carry on eating.

The cider menu includes all the cider you can drink.


- 1- Visit the Cristóbal Balenciaga Museum, where you'll find our special edition "sister products" on sale.

- 6- Go out for pintxos, washed down with txakoli, following this pub crawl: Elkano txiki, Maruka Gastro, Itxaspe, Xagu, Politena...
- 7- Be happy at one of its grills: Elkano, Txoko, Kaia, Iribar, Mayflower, Astillero...
- 8- G&Ts and delicatessen on the **Amona** *María* terrace looking over the port.
- 9- German beers at the *Aldibier beer* hall, with stunning views.
- 10- Watch the sun go down from the terrace at *Ketarri*.
- 11- And then take a stroll from Getaria to Zarautz along the coastal route, 4 km of pure Bay of Biscay.



Once there, we'd recommend you take to the sea as you can catch the little boat that crosses over to Hendaye and live it up in La France.

Walk down the Butrón promenade, as far as the marina. We're going to recommend three unmissable spots here.

We love **El Curry Verde**, our favourite vegetarian place. A great place that's not just for veggies. (Average price €20).





Basque Taberna, a funky spot for a sandwich or some snacks. We love their checked table clothes and the décor (average price €15).

Rodeo Burguer, if burgers are your thing, drop in here (average price €15).

If you're after pintxos, Calle San Pedro is quite literally right up your street. One of the funkiest streets in the world, the beautiful coloured houses are just begging to be photographed.

First stop, **Gran Sol**. Go in and let your instincts guide you.

Very close by, you'll find Bar Restaurante **Itsaspe**, also ideal for lunch with a wonderful little terrace presided over by an olive tree.

Be sure to stop off at our favourite slow bakery, **Amona Margarita**, the ideal spot to take it easy with a good cup of coffee and one of their delicious pastries or their incredible bread.

Follow the route to the old town and here our first stop, opposite the hotel Obispo, is **Bar Etxeberria**. If you get the chance, try their piparrak in tempura.

Gastroteka Danontzat, we love their little terrace between streets. If you like cheese, you'll feel right at home, although it's worth trying all the other exquisite deliciousness they sell here.

If you fancy eating in a restaurant, we would heartily recommend **Restaurante Alameda** (see unmissable restaurants section). One of our favourites. (Average price €75)

Arroka Berri: High recommendable value for money. A safe bet. (Average price €40)

If you're feeling intrepid and fancy a trip in a glider, call **flydonosti:** 633 04 55 60, and you'll be the envy of Instagram, if you're more of a water-baby the **HS2 surf center** awaits.

And to finish off, don't leave Hondarribia without dropping into our favourite place where it is always springtime: **Endanea**. This garden centre is a little piece of heaven on Earth, unmissable!!

Get ready because you're about to experience the natural high of exquisite taste, good times and utter gluttony. Let's not pretend otherwise.

You've already heard that Bilbao is famous for the Guggenheim, the Isozaki Towers, San Mamés stadium, the Arriaga Theatre and all that stuff you read in the guidebooks.

So, I'm not going to tell you what you already know.

But who am I to talk like this?

et's start on a Friday evening

Drop your travel bag off at the hotel, we're going out for a beer, in style.

I'll wait for you in the Bar Singular because we're going to take a foam bath.

At **the Bar Singular**, Sabino and Lide really know how to put a smile on the face of anyone who loves craft beer and fine wine. What's more, they've also managed something strange - this bar serves some of the best food in Bilbao despite its lack of kitchen.

But don't dawdle at the bar. Mosey on down to the back where there are high-backed sofas in front of a roaring fire, like those British pubs that become second homes for their regulars.

You'll be feeling peckish, so let's go for dinner. We're off to a restaurant that has more than proven that Japanese cooking is not at all what we've grown used to.

We've booked a table at Kuma. Seriously, book in advance or you'll go hungry.

Kuma run by Daniel Lomana is more than just a Japanese restaurant. It's a culinary experience, another story, another level entirely.

Lomana worked at Kabuki in Madrid and at Nobu in London. Then, he spent considerable time in Japan really getting to grips with its cuisine and its thousand-year-old culture.

The pleasure starts as you watch how they slice the fish at the bar and ends when you leave the restaurant unable to believe the mixture of flavours that have just exploded in your mouth.

So, you'll want to polish off this Friday with a proper drink and just nearby, there's a dream trio of bars:


- **1. Residence**, run by Manu Iturregui, serving the most incredible selection of whiskeys for miles around.
- **2. La Mula de Moscú** with signature cocktails from the Mind Shakers team.
- 3. And the latest: Sumerian Club.

We'll call it a day on this fun Friday in Bilbao's 'ensanche' area and we'll begin again on Saturday back at the same bar.









Warning! Don't eat breakfast. Today we are going to pay tribute to Bilbao's finest.

We have a brunch booking at the **Hotel Miró**, opposite the Guggenheim.

The All-Day Breakfast at the Miró is the mother of breakfasts in Bilbao. In fact, it's practically breakfast, lunch and dinner all rolled into one.

You'd better come with an empty stomach because not clearing your plate should be declared a mortal sin at the very least. All homemade. Most of the food is produced locally.

Craft jams, organic coffee, homemade cakes, free-range eggs, fresh fruit, natural juices.... and the real joy of this breakfast is the silence and the background music.

I can assure you that after this, you'll want to walk it off, so you have the ideal option right in front of you. Let's take a long stroll from the Guggenheim to the Old Town.





Along the way, we'll see all of Abandoibarra, the Isozaki towers, City Hall, El Arenal, the Arriaga theatre and then we'll delve into the Old Town.

Let's pass on a sit-down lunch for the time being as today's breakfast was heavy-going. However, a vermouth and the odd pintxo will go down a treat.

And NO. We're not going to the tourist bars. We're going to some real bars. Bars that make us smile at the very first sip:

The vermouth in **Ander Etxea** with its obligatory 3 olives.

On in **Taberna Basaras**, which is more than just a bar and more like a temple to worship hot, peppered anchovies.

And **Baster**, that, as well as serving a delightful vermouth, will also whip up a Spanish omelette to take your breath away.

You won't have room for anything else, so let's take another walk. This time along Gran Via.

Feel free to roam along this great boulevard. We'll pass historic bakeries such as Arrese and outstanding architecture. Because before Frank Ghery came along, Bilbao already boasted the Beaux Arts style on the Bank of Bilbao, eclecticism on the Palacio Foral, the neoflamenco style of the Palacio Chávarri, the Modernism of the Montero building...

What's more, there's the thrill of trying the famous Crab pintxo at **El Globo**, next to the Government Building.

You might be getting weary, so I'll offer you a truce - we'll walk along Gran Via as far as the Doña Casilda park. Breathe it all in and soak it up. Then, when you get to the Palacio Euskalduna (the living image of the Bilbao's gobsmacking transformation over the last quarter of a century), you can take the tram.

You'll ride through all Abandoibarra as far as the **Mercado de la Ribera** (Riverbank Market) because I've got a brilliant plan there for what's left of Saturday.













A glass of wine on the terrace at **Txinpum**. A coffee or a beer at **Bihotz**. Whatever you fancy at the **Marzana 16** tavern.

This is the neighbourhood I call home and it's impossible to describe its transformation over the last few years in just a few lines. You'll be wanting some dinner and luckily, you're in just the right place:

- * Refined cuisine at Mina.
- * Simple innovation at Al Margen.
- * Unruly recipes at Dando la Brasa.
- * Even Calabrese pizza from the **Demaio brothers**.

It's up to you to decide how much you want to spend. You'll have a great time wherever you choose.

Having got this far, it'd be best to turn in before we start our final fling.





100% Bilbao Sunday

I'll make it crystal clear - you can't leave Bilbao without trying the mille-feuille pastry from **Charamel Gozotegia**. So, let's have breakfast there.

Then, our plan is a real institution for any local worth their salt - a visit to the flower market in El Arenal and the antiques market in Plaza Nueva.

Once there, you really have to try a crab waffle at **Gure Toki**, , pop into Plaza Unamuno for a mushroom pintxo from **Bacaicoa**, a gilda (green pepper/olive on a stick) at **Fermín** or some 'tigres' (mussels with tomato) at **Baste**.

Don't overdo it though, because we're going to have a slap-up lunch today.

The cherry on the cake for this weekend in Bilbao is a table at **Los Fueros**.

It's the oldest bar in Bilbao. It's been open in the Old Town since 1878. A few years ago, it was bought out by Fernando Canales who put Paul Ibarra in charge of the kitchen, following his previous job running the R&D department at the Etxanobe restaurant.





What happened? Bilbao's classic recipes were taken apart and then put back together in surprising ways.

My recommendation is the 'De Bilbao de toda la vida' (Born and bred in Bilbao) menu. It's a celebration of simple recipes, paying tribute to Bilbao's most typical cuisine.

And what better to finish off this weekend in Bilbao in style?

Now it's time to go home and think about all the pintxos you didn't try, all the fascinating spots that remain undiscovered and miss the people who are both boastful and friendly and who never tire of lauding their city.

Bilbao.

They say that you should always have an excuse to go back, so there you have it. I'm pretty sure you'll be back and so are you. Aren't you?



The person responsible for turning this tiny fishing village into the very pinnacle of chic was actually Spanish, Eugenia de Montijo. She was certainly not just a pretty face as she persuaded her husband, Napoleon III, to build a palace on the "grand plage" at Biarritz, making this beautiful city eternally fashionable.

Biarritz is also the historic surfing capital of Europe thanks to Peter Viertel, husband of Deborah Kerr. When she was shooting in Biarritz in 1957, he brought his boards over from California and became the first person to ride the Côte des Basques waves, in a town where surfing is practically a religion these days.

It's impossible not to fall in love with Biarritz, its 6 km of fine sandy beaches and therapeutic waters, its stately homes, its chocolates, its cheerful market, its surfers, its shops, its walks, streets and that special atmosphere that lights up this impressive city at every step.

We'll start the day in *LES HALLES*, a happy hunting ground for foodies.

Exquisite products that you can taste as well as buy: cheese, seafood, oysters, truffles, etc. It's a fine gastronomic spread. Open every day until 2 pm.

Afterwards, you can enjoy one of the bars around the market. Le Comptoir du Foie Gras, Le Bar Jean, Les Contrebandiers, Café du Commerce...

Then we're off on a stroll from one end of Biarritz to the other.

LIGHTHOUSE

Biarritz lighthouse was built in 1834 and stands 73 metres above sea level.

Climb its 248 steps and admire its panoramic view over Biarritz

Then, relax with a drink in the bar next to the lighthouse *Pavillon du Phare*.

GRANDE PLAGE

Now, let's cross Miramar beach as far as, *Grande Plage*, a picture-postcard beach with its stripy beach huts, plus the imperial palace that is now the fabulous *Hôtel du Palais*.

This is Biarritz's central beach, right next to the *Casino* and the Bellevue conference centre.

FISHING PORT AND VIRGIN OF THE ROCK

The Fishing Port is a real delight. Its late 19th century fishermen's cottages have been turned into restaurants such as *Chez Albert* where you can feast on excellent fresh fish and seafood. After lunch, take a stroll up to the *Virgin of the Rock*.

Legend tells that a terrible storm stopped a boat from reaching port one night, but a miraculous light shone out through the darkness, guiding the fishermen to the coast. To show their thanks, the fishermen built the statue to the virgin on an islet which you can currently visit by crossing a bridge. The *Aquarium* is our next suggestion followed by a refreshing beer or *G&T* at *Olatua* with wonderful views.

THE IMPERIAL CHAPEL

The Imperial Chapel was built in 1864 on Empress Eugenia's request. This charming construction of **Roman-Byzantine and Hispanic-Moorish style**, has been dedicated to the Virgin of Guadalupe (also known as Our Lady of Guadalupe), the Mexican black virgin. It was listed as a **historical monument in 1981**.

OLD PORT BEACH

One of our favourite places is this tiny beach slotted among the rocks, sheltered from the wind and waves. This was Biarritz's former whaling port, hence its name.

We suggest eating at *L'Arena*, *les Baigneuses* followed by an ice cream at *Eden Rock Café* hanging over the sea.

VILLA BELZA

Built in 1889, stands mysteriously on a rock facing the ocean. It features in many legends, appears as the backdrop for several movies, and also welcomes you to a great beach:

CÔTE DES BASQUES


If you want to start surfing, this is your beach. You can rent equipment there, with or without an instructor.

Before or after getting in the water, *Le surfing* is a funky restaurant to help you top up your energy levels. The bar next door has great views and comfy sofas to take it easy watching the surfers, *Bar de la Côte*.

















As the sun goes down, *Etxola Bibi* is a wonderful beach bar with music and snacks to cheerfully bid the day farewell.

One last sister tip before leaving the coast, at low tide you can walk right round to one of our favourite beach clubs that is every bit as good as anything Ibiza has to offer: **Blue Cargo**, with hammocks and parasols on Ilbarritz beach, where you can eat right on the sand because it always feels like summer.

If it's souvenirs you're after, take a stroll down rue *Gambetta* and rue *Mazagran* and check out their fun shops where you can buy espadrilles from les sandales d'Eugénie and wear them straight away to stroll around the terraces on Sainte Eugénie square and visit the crypt with the same name. Carry on as far as *Café Miremont*, a delicious tearoom from 1872 with all the essence of yesteryear.

Buy chocolates at *Pariès* and macaroons in *Maison Adam*, and finish your day at *Chez Coco* a pizzeria right in the centre of Biarritz that owes its name to mademoiselle Coco Chanel as this was a place where she used to sew.
